I utilize solution-focused brief therapy as well as eclectic therapy with individuals, couples and families who are trying to construct healthy responses to problems they are experiencing or to traumas that have happened to them. Since we all are connected in some way to larger systems (family, employment, social, etc.) some of our work together will explore integrating the strengths or examining the deficits/weaknesses of those systems. Sessions will have structure. My communications will be open, direct, sensitive, honest, and include humor. Your ability to communicate in a like manner will facilitate successful outcomes for you.

BACKGROUND

From 1995 until the July, 2009, I was the Director of the Child Advocacy Center of Lane County, now named the Kids FIRST Center, during this time, as a forensic interviewer I interviewed approximately 5000 children and youths reported to have been sexually or physically abuse or who were reported to have suffered some other trauma.

From 1964 until 2007 I was a certified police officer. I worked for 12 years with the Chicago Police Department and then with the Eugene Police Department. From 1978 until 2007 I worked as an Investigator with the Lane County District Attorney's Office.

LICENSE

I am licensed through the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists; I will abide by its Code of Ethics. To maintain my license I am required to participate in annual continuing education taking classes dealing with subjects relevant to this profession.

FEES

My fee is \$120 per therapy hour (50 minutes).
